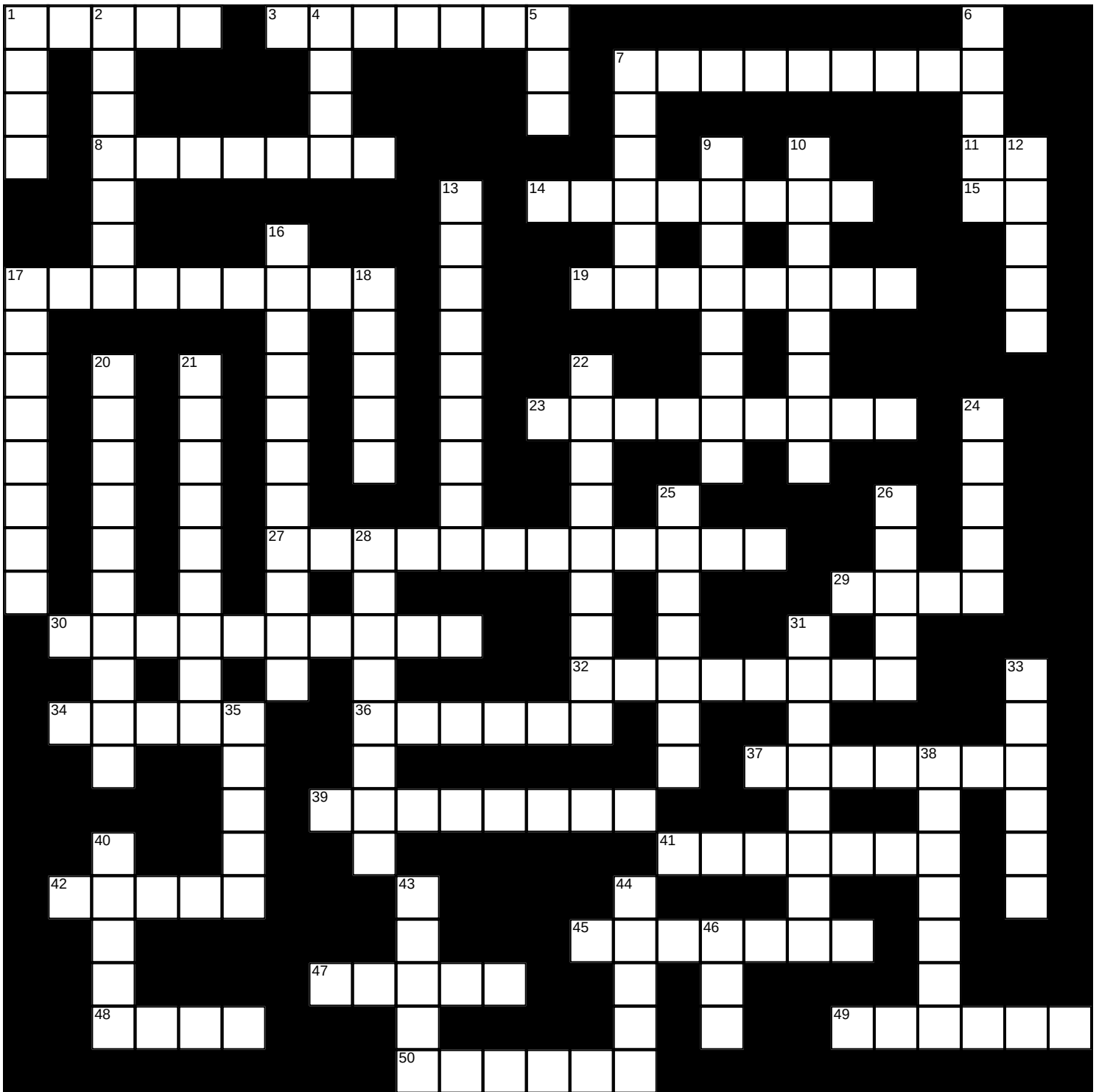

- 4 The special exhibition First Royals of Europe takes visitors on an epic journey from the Neolithic Age to the end of the \_\_\_\_\_ Age.

- 37 Built in 1853 and constructed using the pièce-sur-pièce technique, this iconic Nanaimo landmark is both a municipal heritage site and the last remaining free-standing wooden Hudson's Bay Company tower in North America.
- 39 The Daniel Weetaluktuk Museum in \_\_\_\_\_, Nunavik is named for the first Inuit archaeologist in Canada.
- 41 A piece of tiered French furniture.
- 42 \_\_\_\_\_ House in London, Ontario is celebrating its 190th birthday this year!
- 45 Each September, the Sharon Temple National Historic Site & Museum places \_\_\_\_\_ in nearly all 40 of the Sharon Temple's windows for their Illumination event, which features a music concert inside the magnificent building.
- 47 Lucian \_\_\_\_\_, an artist represented in the Beaverbrook Art Gallery collection, is the grandson of the father of modern psychology.
- 48 On Saturdays, the Nelson Museum offers guided tours in a \_\_\_\_\_ War bunker underneath the local post office.
